Profile – Yayasan Spiritia

History

Spiritia was formed in 1995 by Suzana Murni and several other colleagues as a support group for and by people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHAs). The initial objectives were: 1) provide a safe and confidential environment for PLHAs to meet and share experiences, and 2) provide information about living with HIV/AIDS. During its development, Spiritia was aware that to change an unsupportive environment to become more supportive, Spiritia must work with parties outside the support group. Because of this, Spiritia developed itself and started to carry out a more comprehensive program.

Mission

Spiritia will strive to improve the quality of life of PLHAs and assist in creating a supportive and non-discriminative approach to PLHAs by the community. Spiritia's philosophies and services will take no regard for gender, race, religion/ beliefs, socio-economic level, educational background or sexual orientation.

Objectives

- Empower PLHAs so that they can respond to their own concerns and encourage their involvement in efforts to respond to AIDS.
- Improve PLHAs access to care and support by starting and maintaining cooperation with related individuals and institutions.
- Promote an objective and non-discriminative attitude towards PLHAs among decision makers and the general community.

Philosophy

- Spiritia believes that there is a close relationship between HIV prevention and care/support efforts. Efforts to prevent infection will only be successful if HIV care and support is well-executed and have high regards for human rights.
- PLHAs, as people whose lives have been directly touched by HIV, are the subject and part of the solution to the problems of HIV/AIDS, not objects and not the problem.

Profil – Yayasan Spiritia

Sejarah

Spiritia dibentuk tahun 1995 oleh Suzana Murni dan beberapa rekan lain sebagai kelompok dukungan (support group) dari dan untuk orang yang hidup dengan HIV/AIDS (Odha). Tujuan pada saat awal itu adalah: 1) menyediakan suasana yang aman dan terjaga kerahasiannya untuk Odha bertemu dan berbagi pengalaman, dan 2) menyediakan informasi seputar hidup dengan HIV/AIDS. Dalam perkembangannya, Spiritia menyadari bahwa untuk mengubah lingkungan yang tidak mendukung menjadi mendukung, Spiritia perlu bekerja sama dengan pihak selain anggota kelompok dukungan. Oleh karena itu, Spiritia kemudian mengembangkan diri dan mulai menjanakan program yang lebih terpadu.

Misi

Spiritia berusaha meningkatkan mutu hidup Odha dan membantu terciptanya sikap yang mendukung serta tidak diskriminatif terhadap Odha di masyarakat. Dalam pandangan dan layanannya, Spiritia tidak membedakan jenis kelamin, ras, agama/kepercayaan, tingkat sosial ekonomi, latar belakang pendidikan, dan orientasi seksual.

Tujuan

- Memberdayakan Odha agar bisa menanggapi permasalahannya sendiri serta mendorong keterlibatan mereka dalam upaya penanggulangan AIDS.
- Meningkatkan penjangkauan dukungan dan perawatan bagi Odha dengan memulai dan memelihara kerja sama dengan lembaga dan individu terkait.
- Mendorong sikap objektif dan tidak diskriminatif terhadap Odha di kalangan pengambil keputusan dan masyarakat umum.

Falsafah

- Spiritia percaya bahwa ada keterkaitan erat antara upaya pencegahan dan upaya dukungan/perawatan HIV. Upaya mencegah penularan akan berhasil jika dukungan dan perawatan HIV dilaksanakan dengan baik dan menjunjung tinggi hak asasi manusia.
- Odha sebagai orang yang hidupnya tersentuh langsung oleh HIV adalah subjek dan bagian dari penyelesaian masalah HIV/AIDS, bukan objek dan bukan masalah sendiri.
